This Office also serves as a channel for the people to have an access on the program and services of the National Government particularly The Department of Social Welfare and Development.

The Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office performed its mandate to raise the welfare of our disadvantaged sector through our different programs, projects and activities based on the classification to wit;

# PROMOTION OF RIGHTS & WELFARE OF THE POOR AND THE DISADVANTAGED

Our social welfare services focus on welfare and protection of children, women, families and communities, persons with disabilities, older persons and solo parents. Accomplishment for CY 2023 in the delivery of social welfare services are:

#### CHILD WELFARE PROGRAM

#### **Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) Program**

ECCD Program aims the importance of child-friendly, family-focused and community-based programs that not only serve to strengthen ongoing social service programs, but improve the physical and mental capacity of children. The objective of ECCD is to nurture the children for their physical and mental development and to prepare them for schooling with right attitudes and habits.

#### **Child Development Service Program**

#### a) Provision of Program Materials to Child Development Center

The cost of this project is THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (Php 300, 000.00) which will benefit seventeen (17) Child Development Centers (CDCs).

The purchased materials will be distributed to all seventeen (17) CDWs depending on their needs and requests TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (Php 250,000.00) is alloted for capital outlay while the remaining ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS was allocated for MOOE.

The MSWD Office facilitated the Distribution of Supplies and Materials to Seventeen (17) Child Development Workers.

Program Implementation Review (PIR) for 12<sup>th</sup> Cycle Supplementary Feeding Program for CDWs.

Conducted with a total amount of Php 47,850.00 under Local Council for the Protection of Children (LCPC) Fund.













#### Orientation Workshop on New ECCD Assessment Tool

This training is funded under Local Council for the Protection of Children (LCPC) with a total of Php 81,030.00 for food, supplies/materials and honorarium for resource speakers. This training was conducted last December 5-7, 2023.

#### > Supplementary Feeding Program (SFP) 12<sup>th</sup> Cycle

Implemented 12<sup>th</sup> Cycle Supplementary Feeding Program (SFP) to five hundred ninety one (591) children of Child Development Service (CDSP) from March 1, 2023 to May 13, 2023 funded by the DSWD FO IV- MIMAROPA in the amount of Php 1,063,800.00.

As part of the DSWD's contribution to the Early Childhood Care and Development Program (ECCD) of the government, the Supplementary Feeding Program (SFP) is continuously implemented by the DSWD through the MSWD Office. This program is the provision of snacks and hot meals in addition to the regular meals to children currently enrolled in CDCs.

- ➤ 25 reported CEDC cases in the office as of January December 2023. Mostly cases are Delinquency, Misdemeanor, Child Support/Child Custody and Sexually Abused Children. The MSWDO give intervention to clients such as;

  - 3. Provided financial assistance
  - 4. Facilitated Legal Assistance
  - 5. Facilitated Agreement for Child Custody/Child Support
  - 6. Referral for Protective Custody/ Institution for Children

#### Assistance to VAWC Victims, Abused Children, (Gad Project) PHP 100,000.00

18 VAWC cases was reported in the office 14 walk-in clients and 4 were referred by the VAW Desk Officers assigned in their respective Barangays as from January-December 2023. Clients were given interventions such as Counselling sessions, Home Visitation, Provision of Financial Assistance. Also, the MWSDO facilitated agreements of both parties and facilitated Legal Assistance to some victims seeking for proper legal procedures and justice.







#### > Solo Parents

Solo parents renewed their Solo Parent ID Cards (SPIC) and MSWDO conducted counselling sessions/dialogues needing psychosocial interventions.





- Registered 203 Solo Parents, 166 female and 37 male. Issued new and renewed Identification Cards.
- ➤ Referred client to MALASAKIT Center for medicines, laboratory tests, and hospital bill assistance.
- Extended financial assistance to 83 clients that are in crisis situations in the amount of Php 250,000.00 under Aid to Individual in Crisis Situation (AICS), for which 56 clients received Php 1,500-5,000.00 for medical assistance, 22 clients received Php 2,000.00-5,000.00 for burial/funeral assistance, 3 client received Php 3, 000.00 for transportation and 2 clients received Php 2,500 and 10,000.00 for Emergency Shelter Assistance (ESA).

Provided counseling sessions to walk-in clients. Common problems or issues are child custody, financial support, interference of in-laws and the like.

Issued a total number of 131 Certificate of Indigency to families with low income to be used for the following purposes: a.) Availment of One Romblon Health Card; b.) Availment of financial assistance; c.) availment of free registration fee for Certificate of Live Birth; and petition of Change of First Name (RA 9048); d.) Availment of PHILHEALTH CARD e.) Availment of Public Attorney Office's (PAO) legal services; f.) Availment of free fee in securing DEATH CERTIFICATE; g.) Availment of Educational Scholarship Program of Philippine Science High School h.) Availment of medical services (Hospital Bill); i.); and j.) Court related purposes.






#### Financial Assistance to VAW Desk Officers (Php 264, 000.00)

In compliance with the said provision, LGU Santa Fe has set aside an appropriation in support to all VAW Desk Officers. This project comprises of the provision of financial assistance in a form of honorarium for performing the functions as VAW Desk Officers.

The sole requirement to claim the honorarium is the on-time and religiously submitting the monthly and quarterly VAWC Reports. This report is submitted to the MSWDO and the MSWDO submits the consolidated quarterly reports to the MGLOO.



## Strengthening and Monitoring Functionality of VAW Desk Officers (GAD Project) Php 100,000.00

The Barangay VAW Desk Officers are the front liner in the implementation of this law. Given this crucial role, the designated Barangay VAW desk person shall undergo appropriate training that would capacitate them in performing this function.

The training was scheduled last December 18-20, 2023.



















#### Food-for-Work

Seventeen (17) Child Development Centers (CDCs) facilitated and conducted Food-for-Work program to parents of children enrolled at CDCs last July 24-28, 2023. 44 beneficiaries every Barangay benefited the project.

#### **PWD Social Pension**

The Provincial Government provided cash grants to 117 qualified Persons-with-Disability under Social Pension of Php 500.00 per month, per beneficiary and released every quarter with a total amount of Php175,500.00 for 2023.









#### ENHANCE TULOY ARAL WALANG SAGABAL PROGRAM (ETAWAG)

Community Based Rehabilitation Program for Children with Disability.

Para-Teacher ensures that children with disability are able to maximize their physical and mental abilities, to access regular services and opportunities, and to become active contributors to the community and society at large. E-TAWAG Program's focus is to teach children on the daily living skills such as grooming, dressing, toileting, tooth brushing and bathing, and eating.

Currently, the Para-Teacher has an enrollees of 16 CWD comprising with 12 males and 4 females.









#### Provision of Milk and Vitamins to Children with Disability under E-TAWAG Program

The provision of giving milk and vitamins to children with disability was implemented under the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office. ETAWAG





PROGRAM is a community-based project designed to provide opportunities to develop the children's physical, social, mental and psychological functioning in preparation for their integration into day care, regular or special education, and into community life.







